

## Breast Assessment Unit celebrates another academic achievement

Nov 23 The Fiona Stanley Hospital (FSH)

10 Breast Assessment Unit are celebrating yet another academic achievement following their success at the recent Provincial Surgeons Australia symposium.



Held in Western Australia, FSH was well represented with three poster and two oral presentations showcased at the meeting – the highest number of presentations represented from a single hospital.

## Presentations included:

- A User-Friendly Interface to Optimise the Usability of a Device to Image the Surgical Cavity During Breast Conserving Surgery
- Pilot Australian Trial of Superparamagnetic Iron Oxide Nanoparticle (Magtrace) as a viable alternative to Technetium 99 in Sentinel Lymph Node Biopsy for Breast Cancer
- Magseed pre-operative localisation for non-palpable breast lesions in a tertiary hospital: The Fiona Stanley Hospital Breast Unit experience.

The Fiona Stanley Fremantle Hospitals Group breast theatre team also received special recognition for being a finalist for the Jim Pryor Begonia prize for their invention of a simple holder to prevent the Sentimag probe from falling and breaking.

FSH Head of Head of Breast Service Dr Saud Hamza said this is the fourth academic success unit has achieved this year.

"This is the fourth academic achievement for our unit following two oral presentations at the Royal College meeting in Adelaide, a poster presentation at the ASBD meeting in Adelaide and winning the first prize at the Dubai International meeting," Saud said.
